This course provides basic training in wildland fire suppression and crew person subject overage includes wildland fire behavior, skills of wildland fire suppression, practice with common fire line hand tools, and working safely in wildland fire environment. **[Meets U.S. Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management requirements for Firefighter Type 2: L-180, S-130 and S-190.]**

- This course will include an understanding of the Incident Command System, wildland fire behavior, basic firefighting skills, human performance skills, situation awareness, communication, and risk management.
