By wearing purple and/or wearing a purple ribbon October 10, 2018 to bring awareness to the issue of Domestic Violence . Across the country, families and friends of victims have adopted the purple ribbon to remember and honor their loved ones who have survived domestic violence, and who are still suffering at the hands of their perpetrators, and those that have lost their lives. By wearing purple, we help lift the silence that has fallen on our Tribal communities and stand in support of the protection and safety of Native American survivors of intimate partner abuse everywhere.

The ITCC Family Violence Prevention & Services program provides emergency food, clothing, shelter and transport and services to victims of family violence. Through Family Violence Victim Advocates (FVVA), trained and assisted by ITCC, Native Americans residing in California are provided with emergency services, referrals and workshops for effective education and intervention in Violence Awareness issues. The (FVP&SP) program is the largest consortium of Tribal Governments joined together to put an end to violence in the nation.
