Emergency Services Specialist Training Update  
at Blue Lake Rancheria.

I have been attending the National Emergency Management Advanced Academy (NEMAA) in Blue Lake for three out of four weeks over a six-month period hosted by the Emergency Management Institute, California Specialized Training Institute, and FEMA. This academy is designed for emerging leaders and mid-level managers wanting to advance their skill set. I learned skills critical to performing leadership responsibilities such as program management and oversight, effective communication at all levels, integrated collaboration, and strategic thinking.

NEMAA provides students the opportunity to demonstrate their critical thinking ability through group discussions, group projects, individual projects, and a research paper. I then can apply the key learning concepts from the curriculum relative to their strengths, weaknesses, organization, and performance environment. The first class was E/L0451: A survey of advanced concepts in emergency management. This class went into emergency managements history and how emergency management has changed of the years with group work projects involving case studies of previous disaster. The second class was E/L0452: Assessment and application of professional style in emergency management. This class went into different styles of professionalism in the emergency management world and how not all styles will work within emergency management. It also delves into emergency management and dealing with politics, policies, procedures, and interaction with elected local government. The third class was E/L 0453: Advanced concepts and issues in the emergency management organization. This class went into areas like legal and ethical issues facing emergency mangers today to how previous legal and ethical issues from past disaster shaped emergency management. We also completed a SWOT analysis in a group setting for an organization and I completed a research paper into leadership in emergency management.

After completing this academy, I will have better understanding and knowledge of emergency management that can lead to the future growth of my position. The SIR will have benefited from myself

attending this training by having a more knowledgeable person in this position to lead the SIR into the future of emergency management.

All courses in this Northern California offering will be held at the Blue Lake Rancheria RTIC, 428 Chartin Road, Blue Lake CA 95525.

**Course Description:** The NEMAA is designed for emerging leaders and mid-level managers wanting to advance their skill set. Students learn skills critical to performing leadership responsibilities such as program management and oversight, effective communication at all levels, integrated collaboration, and strategic thinking.

The NEMAA provides students the opportunity to demonstrate their critical thinking ability through a guided Research Project. Students apply the key learning concepts from the curriculum relative to their strengths, weaknesses, organization, and performance environments. This series of courses is designed for current and emerging leaders in emergency management.

**Target Audience:** NEMAA is designed for emergency management professionals with a minimum of three years' experience directly with an Emergency Management (EM) organization or three years' experience with a significant role directly connected to the Profession of Emergency Management or a recognized EM organization; to include, but are not limited to Public Health, Higher Education, Medical, and Private Sector organizations or companies with a role in Emergencies and Disasters.

- Employed or directly connected with Emergency Management (EM)
  - Examples: Federal, Military, State, Local, Tribal, Territorial, and Consortium EM
- Directly connected with the Profession of Emergency Management (EM) or a recognized EM organization
  - Examples: Public Health, Higher Education, School Systems, NGO's, Private Sector Business Continuity/EM
